Work	1. PROJECT BACKGROUND			
specification (and Technical specification s)	The South African National Energy Development Institute (SANEDI) is a state-owned entity established under the National Energy Act (Act No. 34 of 2008). The Act provides for SANEDI to direct, monitor and conduct energy research and development, promote energy research and technology innovation, as well as undertake measures to promote energy efficiency throughout the economy.			
	The Department Science and Innovation (DS) contracted SANEDI as the Energy Secretariat, monitor and review programme progress, and provide oversight of its four Flagship Programmes. The DSI transfers funds to SANEDI, which in turn disburses to the Centres of Competencies (COCs) who implement the Research, Development Innovation (RDI) programmes. The agreement between the DSI and SANEDI warrants annual financial audits to be conducted to ensure good governance and financial prudence.			
	 PROJECT OBJECTIVE Invite Financial Audit Firms to submit proposals to conduct Generally Recognised Accounting Principles forcurrent and future transfers over a period 3 years for funds disbursed by the DSI to SANEDI and the EnergySecretariate Programme. 			
	 Appoint an accredited service provider who has requisite skills and experience with extensive financial andauditing experience, along with extensive knowledge of the PFMA. Make such appointment for the audit period 01 April 2021 to March 2022 and 01 April 2022 to March 2023and any financial year that will need to be audited within the 3-year period. 			

Conduct financial audit services in line with agreed procedures of the International Standard On Related Services (ISRS) 4400 insofar financial statement of income and expenditure for funds disbursed by the DSIto SANEDI, based on Agreements concluded in:

- > 2021-2022 Fiancial Year (FY)
- > 2022-2023 FY
- > Any financial year that will need to be audited in the next 3-year period.

3. SCOPE OF WORKS

The service provider is expected to carry out certain agreed procedures in line with International Standard On Related Services (ISRS) 4400 as described below with respect to the statement of income and expenditure of the Energy Secretariat funds, based on the agreements concluded during the 2021/2022 FY and contracts concluded during the 2022/2023 FY between SANEDI and Department of Science and innovation (DSI) for the period 01 April 2021 to 31 March 2022 and 01 April 2023 to 31March 2023, and any other contracts in the next 3 years. The procedures are authorized below and may include any other relevant procedures deemed necessary.

- 1. Verify the opening balances as per the audited.
- 2. financial statements for the 2021/22FY ,2022/23FY and for the next 3 years as the contract for the Energy Secretariat.
- 3. Obtain the March 2021 and March 2022 financial statements and agree the opening balance of the funds per the statements to the financial report period 01 April 2021to 31 March 2022,01 April 2022 to March 2023 and financial statement for the next 3 years during the auditing processes.
- 4. Obtain the contract for the third fund between SANEDI and the DSI concluded in the current financial year, and verify that the transfer/spent is in line with the contract.
- 5. Agree the Income per the current year financial report, to the total funds received recorded in the general ledger. Report any differences identified.
- 6. Agree the DSI income, per the financial report, to copies of bank statements and the ledgers. Report any differences identified.
- 6. Agree all other transfers/spent per the financial report where relevant, to the tax invoice, payment stubs, authorized journals and copies of bank statements. Report any differences identified.
- 7. Recalculate the interest income due to the DSI.
- 8. Prepare separate audit report for each of the funds audited for the period 01 April 2021 to 31 March 2022, 01 April 2022 to March 2023 and for the next 3 years.

- 8. The terms of the accompanying bid have not been, and will not be, disclosed by the bidder, directly or indirectly, to any competitor, prior to the date and time of the official bid opening or of the awarding of the contract.

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender: - the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and - the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

1.2 Preference Points applicable:

a) The applicable preference point system for this tender is the **80/20** preference point system.

1.3 Points for this tender shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price; and
- (b) Specific Goals.

1.4 The maximum points for this tender are allocated as follows:

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 SANEDI reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the SANEDI.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).
- (f) "B-BBEE" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (g) "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (h) "bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (i) "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- "EME" means an Exempted Micro Enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (k) "functionality" means the ability of a tenderer to provide goods or services in accordance with

specifications as set out in the tender documents.

- (I) "proof of B-BBEE status level of contributor" means:
 - B-BBEE Status level certificate issued by an authorized body or person;
 - A sworn affidavit as prescribed by the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice;
 - Any other requirement prescribed in terms of the B-BBEE Act;
 - "QSE" means a qualifying small business enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;

3. FORMULAE FOR PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES

3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

80/20 or 90/10

Where

Ps = Points scored for price of tender under consideration

Pt = Price of tender under consideration

Pmin = Price of lowest acceptable tender

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:

4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

(a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or

(b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system, then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.
