specifications)	The Energy Efficiency Appliance Standards and Labelling (S&L) Programme was initially implemented by the
	Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE) in association with the United Nations Development
	Programme (UNDP) with the aim to reduce energy consumption and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by
	influencing consumers to purchase more energy efficient appliances, removing inefficient appliance and
	encouraging the penetration of higher energy efficient appliances in South African market. At the end of the
	collaboration, DMRE mandated the South African National Development Institute (SANEDI) to implement the S&L
	Programme as an ongoing initiative.
	The amount of waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) generated yearly in South Africa is increasing
	rapidly. Waste from electrical and electronic equipment include household appliances such as refrigerators,
	washing machines and air conditioners to name a few. These appliances contain a mixture of materials that are
	toxic and hazardous. Hazardous waste that is mismanaged poses a serious threat to the environment and human
	health. Not only does WEEE harm the environment if untreated, it also causes the loss of precious metals such as
	copper. In addition to environmental benefits, the strengthening of South Africa's WEEE recycling system and visibility can create jobs and empower existing SMMEs in the sector.
	visibility can create jobs and empower existing sivilvies in the sector.
	A feasibility study was commissioned by the DMRE to determine the viability of an integrated appliance recycling
	system. The Study focused on how the government can enforce the proper handling and disposal of appliances to
	ensure that appliances are dismantled in an environmentally sound manner at the end of their useful life. From
	the findings of the feasibility study the DMRE intend to implement the Energy Efficiency Appliances Recycling
	System Pilot project. The Pilot project will be held in the Gauteng region because it is assumed that the region
	contain the highest number of appliances since it has the highest population. The findings from the Pilot project
	will be used by the DMRE to support the regulation of the appliances recycling sector.

2. Project Objective

To ensure that electrical and electronics appliances are properly disposed at the end of their functional life. When the WEEE are disposed correctly they won't harm the environment and human health.

To determine how the cost for collecting, transporting and recycling appliances will be covered.

To implement appliances recycling pilot project with the aim to inform policy. The pilot project will inform the DMRE on how to best regulate the appliances recycling sector.

To create appliances recycling awareness and educate consumers, manufacturer, retailers and recyclers on how to correctly recycle electrical and electronics appliances.

To ensure that old energy inefficient appliances are not donated/sold to people in lower income groups. It is important for consumers to know that energy inefficient appliances consume excessive amount of energy and it will cost them a lot of money to operate the appliance.

To build capacity and create awareness of the available and new recycling practices resultant from the implementation of this pilot project.

Scope of Works

3. Project scope

The service provider must work with the SANEDI project team to produce the following deliverables as part of the required assessment:

- **3.1.** The S&L team will provide project documents to the service providers so that they can familiarize themselves with the appliances recycling research that has been done. This will help the service provider when developing their inception report and conducting their own research. The following documents will be shared:
- Feasibility Study to determine the viability of an integrated appliance recycling system published in 2020.
- Business Case for DMRE-SANEDI Energy Efficiency Appliance Recycling System Pilot Project and Energy Efficiency Awareness Creation

3.2. Inception report and presentation to include the following:

- a) A background and introduction
- b) Detailed scope of work
- c) Proposed approach to policy assessment for appliances recycling project
- d) Stakeholder approach and consultation plan
- e) Policy assessment task team, the appointed team will work with the SANEDI project team in monthly working meetings to assign tasks contributing to the assessment
- f) Detailed workplan with project activities and timelines
- g) Feedback from recycling industry key players

- h) Recommendations on how to implement a well-planned appliances recycling Project
- **3.3. Policy analysis** to identify any misalignments, gaps and duplications in the existing policy framework for WEEE recycling. Recommend interventions for harmonisation of the relevant standards and policy development or initiatives to strengthen the policy framework for the effective recycling of Large House Household Appliances.
- **3.4.** Complete **stakeholder mapping** for this project presented in a narrative report and quadrant form to understand roles and influence levels of various stakeholders in the sector
- **3.5. Market analysis** to understand the nature of existing recycling facilities in the South Africa and their capacity to process WEEE, de-manufacture Large Household Appliances and treat toxic waste in the process.
- **3.6.** Produce ideal capacitation plan to empower recycling SMMEs to process the relevant WEEE.
- **3.7.** The service provider must be able to demonstrate research findings to the Appliances Recycling System Pilot Project Steering Committee in a maximum of two Project Steering Committee Meeting seatings.

PREFERENCE POINTS CLAIM FORM IN TERMS OF THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS 2022

- 1.2 Preference Points applicable:

- 1.3 Points for this tender shall be awarded for:
 - (a) Price; and
 - (b) Specific Goals.
- 1.4 The maximum points for this tender are allocated as follows:

1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

1.6 SANEDI reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the SANEDI.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).
- (f) "B-BBEE" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (g) "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (h) "bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (i) "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- (j) "EME" means an Exempted Micro Enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (k) "functionality" means the ability of a tenderer to provide goods or services in accordance with specifications as set out in the tender documents.

3. FORMULAE FOR PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES

3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
 - (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
