#### 3. Scope Of Works/Technical Specifications

#### 3.1 BACKGROUND

Mining accounts for up to 60% of South Africa's exports, which is vital for the economic growth and sustainability of the country. The minerals South Africa exports are vital to the economies of the world for downstream manufacturing and thus for an integral part of global economics. However, it is also important to remember that there are some severe environmental impacts due to mining activities, not least of which include air quality as well as rainwater quality and atmospheric particulates that can be severely corrosive. The impact and the effect that this has on the mining industry itself as well as the business and residential support in surrounding occupied areas can significantly impact profit generation for South Africa.

Against the backdrop of providing energy security of supply for industry, particularly mining houses, as well as the South African National Defence Force this project aims to answer unique questions not yet addressed which can have significant impact on boosting the South African economy.

SANEDI, as a government partner, maintains a collaborative partnership with the Department of Defence (DOD) encompassing broad inter departmental support in the energy sector viz. training of members and support towards renewable energy and energy efficiency measure pilot implementation. SANEDI has become an integral partner to DOD in order to assess energy needs and be able to provide preliminary informed advice on plausible, sustainable renewable energy and energy efficiency interventions. SANEDI/DOD collaborations aim to address two main goals, viz., skills development and project implementation for renewable and energy efficient projects.

This project focuses on energy security under specifically South African conditions in a multi-mini-grid scenario with current passive energy efficiency implementation in parallel. In addition to supporting contributions from the DOD, there is also the provision of a "wet lab" in situ site for significant experimental data collection and monitoring, expected to lead to internationally peer-reviewed knowledge not currently available.

Research and development will ultimately be focussed on fact-based business case knowledge support towards the South African mining sector, and defence force, requirements for energy security and technology longevity and performance.

#### 3.2 SCOPE OF WORK

Currently the project has advanced to design and implementation stage, information currently available includes:

- Energy requirements in kilowatts (500kW) for specific point to be served by initial mini-grid implementation
- A formal energy audit will be initiated in early 2024 however this scope of works will require
  utilization of information that is currently available in terms of load demand (monthly
  consumption in kWh)



The project will require the delivery of a full wrap offering including:

- System Design for 500kW electricity system
- Hardware including photovoltaic panels, inverters, batteries and all associated trunking, lagging, wiring and electronic components etc.
- Installation with the associated: labour, certificate of compliance, five-year service plan, hardware guarantees and warranties
- All associated data logging and live measurement data to be installed preferably with a webbased data logging system
- Delivery of hardware to site for storage and payment before 15 March 2024
- Project CIDB compliance including all required standards and safety regulations
- System commissioning and operationalisation by December 2024 is a prerequisite
- System must be modularized (inverters and batteries) to ensure energy security and be able to support additional mini-grid system integration

#### 3.3 DELIVERABLES

Research and development focussed on fact-based business case knowledge support towards the South African mining sector, energy security and technology longevity and performance.

SANEDI has identified a secure site in Limpopo Province that has a variety of distinctive South African climatic conditions, allowing for technology testing under unique circumstances to add to the knowledge of how renewable and energy efficiency technologies can function in South African environments. This site is located very close to multiple-mineral mining operations and exposed to harsh environmental conditions leading to atmospheric particulates, acid rain and corrosion on surfaces, it is also a very warm environment with high solar irradiation and harsh atmospheric challenges.

Mining houses are being encouraged by government to ensure their own energy supply through implementation of renewable and/or alternate energy supply. However, there is, to date, no South African literature on what the effect of harsh environmental conditions will have on technology performance and longevity. This proposed project will determine an energy security solution that will also allow for multiple integrated technology testing under South African climatic and mining industry conditions.

The expected outcomes for the project include:

- Design of the first mini grid system to meet energy needs on the identified buildings
- A rooftop mounted PV system with battery backup that ensures consistent secure electricity supply to the identified buildings
- System warranties and guarantees as well as Service plan to be implemented across defined timeframes
- CIDB compliance
- All standards and safety compliance requirement



#### **Project Management**

The project shall be managed through SANEDI by the Renewables Manager. The consultant will work directly with the Renewables Project Manager. Any project related decisions raised by any party associated with the project compliance and physical application of the technology must be addressed through the SANEDI project manager directly as the contracting party.

Deliverables required of the consultant are listed in the table in section 4 below.

Additional conditions to consider when implementing this project include:

- Military Security (MS) compliance must be ensured for all civilian persons involved in the project/s
  - Requirement for the winning bidder working on site to be security cleared by Defence Intelligence
  - No foreign nationals are eligible to access the site
- Contractors must use identifiable uniform when on military installations
- The DOD and SANEDI are indemnified at all times against contractor loss or injury of any kind.

#### 3.4 DURATION OF THE PROJECT

The project activities are anticipated to be executed and concluded within 12 months from signature of the contract, including the final project hand over. Where project activities experience delays, any deviation from the proposed timeline of activities (Work Plan) must be communicated to SANEDI in writing.

- 1.2 Preference Points applicable:

- 1.3 Points for this tender shall be awarded for:
  - (a) Price; and
  - (b) Specific Goals.
- 1.4 The maximum points for this tender are allocated as follows:

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 SANEDI reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the SANEDI.

#### 2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and

#### 4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:



- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
  - (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
  - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system, then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.
