specifications)	SANEDI Cool Surfaces Programme responds to South Africa's need for energy passive, low cost, low maintenance
	cooling technology for buildings. Cool roofs improve the energy and environmental performance of buildings by
	minimising solar heat gains. The specialised paint coating reflects solar radiation and prevents heat absorption.
	Cool surfaces applied to roofs not only reduce the energy required to cool building interiors significantly but also
	decreases the electricity demand on our grid when rolled out on a large-scale. However, cool surfaces do not
	address extreme cold weather events. Insulation is a complimentary passive-energy, thermal-control technology
	that addresses heat loss in buildings. Insulation can address cold conditions.
	Goal of original project: The collaboration between the cool surfaces and Insulation project confirmed the
	individual impact of the two technologies regarding their typical performances on buildings and compared their
	combined impact that strengthens efficacy in driving efforts for inclusion of mandatory passive heating and
	cooling interventions in the next revision of the EE Building Code SANS 10400 XA. There was a proposal that cool
	coatings can/ should be used to offset R-values reduction of the insulation minimum standard required. The
	project aims to investigate, via data, the claim that neither the passive energy heating nor cooling interventions
	should be reduced by using either to offset SRI or R-values values as the full minimum performance standards of
	each technology is necessary for meaningful results
	2. Project Objectives
	The 12 reference buildings (6 buildings in Masonwabe and 6 in Morkels Cottage) are incomplete -4 buildings with
	no interventions at all, 4 with only cool coatings and 4 with only insulation. Monitoring instruments that had been
	installed in these reference buildings have been removed, leaving damage to the buildings. SANEDI seeks a
	contractor to supply the materials to complete the insulation and cool coating interventions and repair damages
	caused by the decommissioning of the monitoring instruments.

3.2. Morkels Cottage, Strand, Western Cape



Six buildings at approximately 30m2 each.

4. Scope of Works

• The Scope of Works for Completion of WC Reference Buildings Project, requires a turnkey company to provide the following goods and services:

4.1 Assessment and Planning (2 weeks)

Conduct a project site assessment to analyse the 12 buildings current condition.

The SANEDI Baseline Assessment Report will be made available to the bid winner.

The assessment outcome must include the following:

- Identify obstacles that will affect the installation and performance of the insulation and cool coating paint, e.g. repairs
- Determine required number of labourers.
- Verify the surface area to be insulated and those to be cool coated. Map the addresses for intervention.
- Bill of Quantities including all components required for coating application.
- Identify the total quantity of insulation required (m₂) to insulate the roof.
- Detail activities required prior to Preparation of the roof.
- Project planning from inception to commissioning.
- Produce an assessment and planning Report

4.2. Cool reflective coating product supply (2 weeks)

• Vendors must submit copies of their cool reflective coating's manufacturer's verified laboratory certificates. Laboratory Certificate of Product Performance must cover the minimum values for the following tests.

Identify the total quantity of coating and primer required (in litres per square meter) to coat verified roof surface area.

- Deliver and secure the cool surface paint within the first month of the project.
- Manufacturer to provide written recommendations for optimal application of product.
- Clear calculations of Bill of Quantities: Include costs of all equipment and coating.
- Product to be priced per m2 for primer and coating materials.
- All corrections of miscalculations by the supplier will be for the manufacturer's account.

4.3. Insulation product supply (2 weeks)

- Vendor may only use insulation products from manufacturers that are members of the Thermal Insulation Products Systems Association South Africa (TIPSASA) because their laboratory product performance testing certifications are verified and on record with TIPSASA data base.
- Deliver and secure the ISOBOARD EXTRUDED POLYSTYRENE (XPS) insulation within the first month of the project.
- Manufacturer to provide written recommendations for optimal installation of product.
- Clear calculations of Bill of Quantities: Include costs of all equipment and coating.
- Product to be priced per m₂ of insulation materials.
- All corrections of miscalculations by the supplier will be for the manufacturer's account.

4.4. Resourcing and Project Management (2 weeks)

- SANEDI needs the successful bidder to:
- Recruit the **previously qualified labourers from the community** to apply the cool reflective coating and insulation to the reference buildings, under supervision.
- Manage the operations roll out and quality checks on labour for the application of the reflective cool coating and insulation on the 12 buildings.
- Provide a risk management plan for security of product, equipment, and labourers.
- Provide project cost breakdown aligned with the project deliverables.
- Develop work breakdown for the duration of the project.
- Attend progress meeting and provide project feedback.
- Develop Project final report which includes methodology, challenges experienced, and lessons learnt.

4.5. Operations: Cool Coating Application and Insulation Installation (3 weeks)

- Provide personal protective equipment.
- Provide oversight of labour to ensure smooth roll out of project.
- Compile a detailed Project Record Keeping File.

- 1.2 Preference Points applicable:

- 1.3 Points for this tender shall be awarded for:
 - (a) Price; and
 - (b) Specific Goals.
- 1.4 The maximum points for this tender are allocated as follows:

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 SANEDI reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the SANEDI.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).
- (f) "B-BBEE" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (g) "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (h) "bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

- (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
